What They Learn

Guys in ninth through twelfth grade learn and practice the pro-social skills needed for success in high school. Skills are taught directly and practiced through discussion, role play, competitive and cooperative activities, and community service.

Social Bridges' high school curriculum focuses on the following core skills: following social rules, making and keeping friends, stress management, flexibility, communication skills, self-advocacy, social filter, and social prediction.

Tuition Rates & Financial Information
